ABSTRACT REQUIREMENTS AND STRUCTURE

Length Requirements

- Maximum 300 words
- Structured text format
- Clear and concise presentation

Recommended Structure

- 1. Introduction (1-2 sentences)** Briefly outline the relevance of the problem or research question and clearly define the thematic field of the work.
- 2. Research Objective (1-2 sentences)** Formulate the main goal or objectives that the research addresses.
- 3. Methods (1-2 sentences)** Briefly mention the main approaches or methods used (without excessive detail).
- 4. Main Results.** Present the most important findings, statements, or ideas. Avoid excessive details, unnecessary citations, and over-generalizations.
- 5. Conclusions and Significance (1-2 sentences)** State conclusions and briefly emphasize the significance of the work conducted and research prospects.

Example Abstract Structure:

“The increasing trend towards protectionist policies in global trade poses significant challenges to international economic stability. This study examines the impact of recent tariff implementations on emerging market economies.

The research aims to analyze the correlation between protectionist measures and GDP growth in developing countries from 2020-2024.

The study employs econometric analysis using panel data from 25 emerging economies and trade flow statistics.

Results indicate that tariff increases of 10% or more correlate with a 2.3% decrease in GDP growth rates among the studied countries. The analysis reveals that sectors most dependent on international supply chains experienced the greatest negative impact. Additionally, countries with diversified export portfolios showed greater resilience to protectionist measures.

These findings suggest that emerging economies should prioritize trade diversification strategies and strengthen regional economic partnerships to mitigate the effects of global protectionism.”
